The Center for UN Reform Education is seeking interns to assist in the production of one of the Center's upcoming publications.

The main duties will include research; fact checking; attending meetings/interviews and taking notes; as well as minor administrative tasks. The interns will be part of a small team of Research Analysts and will be expected to participate fully in the work of the Center.

The successful applicant will have strong research, writing and interpersonal skills. He or she is well-organized and has an ability to meet deadlines. The environment at the office is informal but the successful applicant should be able to professionally interact with the diplomatic community at the UN.

Interns are expected to work 2-3 days a week for at least 3 months. The Center will provide a small monthly stipend.
