The Optional Protocol to the Convention on the Rights of Persons with Disabilities was adopted on 13 December 2006 during the sixty-first session of the General Assembly by resolution 61/106. The International Convention for the Protection of All Persons from Enforced Disappearance was adopted on 20 December 2006 during the sixty-first session of the General Assembly by resolution 61/177. In accordance with its article 38, the Convention shall be open for signature by all Member States of the United Nations in Paris, on Tuesday, 6 February 2007.

The Secretary-General takes this opportunity to recall that, under established international practice, only Heads of State, Heads of Government or Ministers for Foreign Affairs are empowered, by virtue of their functions, to sign a treaty on behalf of a State without having to produce full powers to that effect. Other representatives wishing to sign a treaty must be in possession of appropriate full powers, which expressly authorize signature of a specified treaty by a named representative issued by one of these authorities.
